

Remote Learning Provision.

The information in this document is intended to provide clarity and transparency to pupils and parents or carers about what to expect from remote education where national or local restrictions require entire cohorts (or bubbles) to remain at home.

The remote curriculum: What is taught to pupils at home:

A boys first day or two of being educated remotely might look different from our standard approach, while we take all the necessary actions to prepare for a longer period of remote teaching. After which time the curriculum followed in school is replicated via remote teaching.

What should my child expect from immediate remote education in the first day or two of pupils being sent home?

Lessons and work will be uploaded via SeeSaw for all to access.

Following the first few days of remote education, will my child be taught broadly the same curriculum as they would if they were in school?

We will teach the same curriculum remotely as we do in school.

How long can I expect work set by the school to take my child each day? This will vary per year group, on average 4-5 hours.

Accessing remote education.

How will my child access any online remote education you are providing?

WCPS uses the online platform SeeSaw and MS Teams for this purpose.

How will my child be taught remotely?

We use a combination of the following approaches to teach boys remotely:

Live Teaching

Recorded teaching

Commercially available websites supporting the teaching of specific subjects or areas including video clips or sequences.

Engagement and Feedback.

What are our expectations for my child's engagement and the support that we as parents and carers should provide at home?

All work must be completed in a timely manner. Where possible adult assistance is recommended.

How will you check whether my child is engaging with their work and how will I be informed if there any concerns?

Every piece of work requires an input this may be written, audio or video.

Work is marked daily and can be sent back with revisions or if not of an adequate standard.

How will you assess my child's work and progress?

Every piece of work will be marked with a written or audio comment.

Additional support for pupils with particular needs.

How will you work with me to help my child who needs additional support from adults at home to access remote education?

Our learning enrichment teacher offers weekly sessions which mimic those taught in school. Work is also differentiated to allow for any pupils who may need additional support.

Remote education for self-isolating pupils.

If my son is not in school because they are self-isolating, how will their remote education differ from the approaches described above?

A work pack with be provided and information sent home to support the work given. Homework will be set on SeeSaw as usual.
