<p><b>English</b></p>	<p><b>Narrative:</b> Traditional and fairy tales, stories with familiar settings, stories about fantasy worlds, stories with predictable and patterned language, stories from a range of cultures.  <b>Non-fiction:</b> Instructions, information texts, recounts.  <b>Poetry:</b> Pattern and rhyme, poems on a theme.  <b>Phonics:</b> Phases 4 &amp; 5 of Letters &amp; Sounds.  <b>Handwriting:</b> Forming upper and lower letters correctly; writing in a cursive script.  <b>Grammar:</b> Using capital letters and full stops, commas in lists, question marks, exclamation marks and plurals.</p>					
<p><b>Mathematics</b></p>	<p><b>Number and Place Value:</b> Count, read, order and write numbers to 100 and beyond; Recall number bonds to 10, 20 and 100; Partition three-digit numbers into hundreds, tens and ones.  <b>Addition and Subtraction:</b> Read, write and interpret mathematical statements involving addition (+), subtraction (-) and equals (=) signs.  <b>Multiplication:</b> Count in multiples of 2s, 5s and 10s; Recall the 2, 5, 10, 3 and 4 times table.  <b>Division:</b> Solve division calculations in the context of sharing objects; Identify division as the inverse of multiplication.  <b>Shape, position and direction:</b> Name and recognise properties of common 2D and 3D shapes; Describe position, direction and movement, including whole half, quarter and three-quarter turns; Recognising right angles.  <b>Time:</b> Tell the time to the nearest 15 minutes on an analogue clock; Calculate time intervals.  <b>Money:</b> Recognise and know the value of different denominations of coins and notes; Calculate money totals and change  <b>Measure:</b> Compare, describe and solve practical problems associated with length, height, mass, weight, capacity and volume  <b>Fractions:</b> Calculate a half and a quarter of regular shapes and amounts  <b>Problem Solving:</b> Apply different mathematical operations to solve word problems using the RUCSAC method</p>
