English	Narrative: Traditional and fairy tales, stories with familiar settings, stories about fantasy worlds, stories with predictable and patterned language, stories from range of cultures.  Non-fiction: Instructions, information texts, recounts.  Poetry: Pattern and rhyme, poems on a theme.  Phonics: Phases 4 & 5 of Letters & Sounds.  Handwriting: Forming upper and lower letters correctly; writing in a cursive script.  Grammar: Using capital letters and full stops, commas in lists, question marks, exclamation marks and plurals.									
Mathematics	Number and Place Value: Count, read, order and write numbers to 100 and beyond; Recall number bonds to 10, 20 and 100; Partition three-digit numbers into hundreds, tens and ones.  Addition and Subtraction: Read, write and interpret mathematical statements involving addition (+), subtraction (-) and equals (=) signs.  Multiplication: Count in multiples of 2s, 5s and 10s; Recall the 2, 5, 10, 3 and 4 times table.  Division: Solve division calculations in the context of sharing objects; Identify division as the inverse of multiplication.  Shape, position and direction: Name and recognise properties of common 2D and 3D shapes; Describe position, direction and movement, including whole half, quarter and three-quarter turns; Recognising right angles.  Time: Tell the time to the nearest 15 minutes on an analogue clock; Calculate time intervals.  Money: Recognise and know the value of different denominations of coins and notes; Calculate money totals and change  Measure: Compare, describe and solve practical problems associated with length, height, mass, weight, capacity and volume  Fractions: Calculate a half and a quarter of regular shapes and amounts  Problem Solving: Apply different mathematical operations to solve word problems using the RUCSAC method
